## BALANCED PORTFOLIOS

Stocks have historically outperformed bonds while having greater risk. The low volatility that bonds have historically generated naturally comes with lower returns. The chart below shows various combinations of the S\&P $50{ }^{\circledR}$ Index, a benchmark commonly used to represent large-cap U.S. stocks with a proxy for bonds, the Barclays Capital Intermediate U.S. Govt./Credit Index. Moving from left to right, the allocation in stocks increases $10 \%$, while the allocation in bonds decreases $10 \%$. While different combinations may appeal to different investors, the $60 \%$ equity $/ 40 \%$ bonds and $50 \% / 50 \%$ blends may provide the best risk/return profiles.
